

Assistant Public Prosecutors (APP) Recruitment by Telangana State Level Police Recruitment Board

1. Eligibility for Telangana State Assistant Public Prosecutor

Minimum Educational Qualification

- Bachelor's degree in any subject along with a Bachelor's degree in Law (LLB/BL) from:
 - Any University established under a Central, Provincial, or State Act in India.
 - Any Institution recognized by the UGC.
 - Equivalent qualifications.
- Candidates who have completed a five-year integrated Law course after Intermediate are also eligible.

Experience

- Must have practiced as an Advocate for at least three (3) years with active practice in Criminal Courts within the State as of the notification date.

Medical Standards

- Must possess sound health and be free from bodily defects or infirmities rendering them unfit for service.
- **Ineligibility:**
 - Candidates with impaired speech, hearing, or sight.
 - Candidates suffering from stammering or stuttering.

Age Limit

- Maximum Age: 34 years as of 1st July 2021.
 - Born not earlier than 2nd July 1987.

Salary Details

- Pay Scale: Rs. 54,220 – 1,33,630 (as per RPS 2020).

Application Fees

- SC/ST Candidates (Telangana State): Rs. 750/-
- All Other Candidates: Rs. 1,500/-

How to Apply?

1. Click on the TS Police Online Application Form link provided.
2. Fill in all the necessary details in the application form.
3. Upload a copy of your recent photograph (if required).
4. Attach scanned copies of necessary documents.
5. Submit the application form to complete the process.

Selection Process

1. Written Examination:

- Two Papers (each of 3 hours' duration):
 - Paper 1: 100 Marks (200 multiple-choice questions).
 - Paper 2: 100 Marks (Descriptive type questions).
- Language: Both papers will be in English only.

2. Final Merit:

- Final selection based on aggregate score from Papers I and II (200 marks).
- Special Representation:
 - First 5% of posts: Combined merit list of all candidates.
 - Remaining 95% of posts: Reserved for local candidates only.
